



Installation:

NOTE: The pictures shown in the User's Manual are for demonstration purposes only. Your computer or product may look slightly different.

- 1. Turn on your computer.
- 2. Locate an available USB port on your computer.
- 3. Plug the USB connector of your Mouse into the USB port of your computer.




4. Your computer will detect your Mouse and the necessary drivers will be installed automatically.

Software Installation:

Your Mouse comes with software that integrates with your Windows[®] Mouse Properties. This software allows you to assign special functions to the 3 programmable buttons on your Mouse. To install the software, please follow the instructions listed below:

- 1. If you have installed any other mouse drivers/software onto your computer, please uninstall them **prior** to the installation of the software for your Mouse to avoid any software conflicts.
- 2. Place the Driver CD into the CD-ROM drive of your computer.
- 3. The Mouse setup screen will start automatically. To start the setup manually, click "Start", then "Run...", type "D:\SETUP.EXE" into the dialog box (NOTE: "D:\" represents the drive letter assigned to the CD-ROM drive you are using. If D is not the letter assigned to your CD-ROM drive, replace D with the appropriate drive letter.), then click "OK".
- 4. Select your language, then click "Continue", and then click "Continue" again to confirm the installation.




5. During the installation, the Windows[®] Logo verification dialog box may appear more than once, click "Continue Anyways" to continue.



6. After the installation is complete, click "Restart" to restart your computer.



7. After your computer has restarted, a new icon will be added to the system tray of your Desktop. The software for your Mouse is now installed successfully.



Mouse Configuration:

To configure your Mouse using the Mouse software, please follow the instruction below:

- 1. Make sure your Mouse is connected to your computer.
- 2. To open the Mouse Properties screen, right click the Mouse icon on the system tray of your Desktop, and then select "Mouse Properties".



3. There are four new tabs added to your Mouse Properties, which are:

Tab	Descriptions
Wheel	The Scroll Wheel on your Scroll Mouse can be configured in this page.
Hardware	This page contains the hardware information of your Scroll Mouse.
Programmable Button	The programmable buttons on your Scroll Mouse can be configured in this page.
About	This page contains the software information of your Scroll Mouse.

4. To configure the Scroll Wheel on your Scroll Mouse, click the "Wheel" tab.

Options	Descriptions
Wheel Mode	WheelMouse Mode: Select this mode to apply the Mouse Wheel settings to your Scroll Mouse.
	MS-Intelli Mouse Compatible Mode:
	Select this mode to apply only the Windows [®] default scroll wheel options.
Scroll Speed	Scroll # lines per scroll unit:
	Select this option, and then specify the number of lines to scroll each time you scroll the scroll wheel on your Scroll Mouse.
	Scroll one page per scroll unit:
	Select this option to scroll through one page each time you scroll the scroll wheel on your Scroll Mouse.
Reverse Scrolling	Reverse Vertical Scroll Direction:
Direction	Select this option to reverse the Up / Down direction of the scroll wheel on your Scroll Mouse.
	Reverse Horizontal Scroll Direction (Shift + Wheel):
	Select this option to reverse the Left / Right direction of the scroll wheel on your Scroll Mouse.
Test Area	This text box can be used to test your settings after you applied the changes.

5. After you made your selections, click "Apply" to save the changes, then click "OK" to close the Mouse Properties screen.

Options	Descriptions
Button Selection	From the drop-down list at the top of the screen, select the button you want to assign function to.
Special	After you have selected the button you wish to assign function to, select one of the functions below:
Functions	Auto Scroll Tapping the button assigned with this function will allow you to move around in a page by scrolling the Scroll Wheel on your Scroll Mouse (or moving your Scroll Mouse in mouse mode). Magic Jump Tap the button assigned with this function will open a set of quick launch boxes (3 x 3) and lets you launch 8 different predefined programs with one click. Switch AP Tap the button assigned with this function to switch among running applications. Data Zoom Tap the button assigned with this function to change the mouse pointer to a zooming box. You can define the zoom size when you assign this function to one of your programmable buttons. Third Button Tap the button assigned with this function will be the same as clicking the middle button (scroll button) on a standard 3-buttons mouse. Double Click Tap the button assigned with this function will be the same as double-clicking the Left button on a standard mouse. Back Tap the button assigned with this function will go back to the previous page in the active screen (if available). Forward Tap the button assigned with this function will go forward to the next page in the active screen (if available).

6. To configure the programmable buttons on your Scroll Mouse, click the "Programmable Button" tab.

8. After you made your selections, click "Apply" to save the changes, then click "OK" to close the Mouse Properties screen.
